



I hereby apply to Mullinalaghta St. Columba's Gaelic Football Club, for Membership of the Club and Membership to Cumann Luthchleas Gael.

I subscribe to and undertake to further the aims and objectives of the Club and of Cumann Luthchleas Gael and to abide by its rules and I pay herewith the appropriate membership fee as determined by the above Club.

- I understand the personal data collected will be used by the Club, the GAA for the contractual purpose of registering (or re-registering) and maintaining my membership.
- I understand that the personal data will be retained by the Club, Clubforce , GAA for such period as my membership subsists.
- I understand that I can resign my membership by writing to the Secretary of the Club, /Gaa and my personal data will then be erased.
- I understand that if I do not provide my personal data me membership cannot be registered with the Club or the GAA.

For Players or Guardians

I am aware it is my personal responsibility to bring to the attention of the team manager or coach any medical condition that could have an impact on my involvement in the activity or event.

I have read the important Data Protection Information and have given my consent by ticking the box, for my information to be used as follows:

- ✓ To provide me with updates regarding Club activities such as matches, meetings, club events, social occasions, fundraising activities, Lotto etc.
- ✓ I am aware that my photograph or video image may be taken whilst attending or participating in games or activities connected with the GAA and I consent to it being used for items like match programmes, yearbooks, match reports, event reports or on websites, social media channels associated with GAA/
- ✓ I understand that I can withdraw my consent at any time by writing to the Club or the GAA.

I understand my rights under Data Protection legislation as outlined below.

Terms & Conditions

(a) The GAA Club Constitution forms the cornerstone of overall governance of Mullinalaghta St. Columba's GFC. Each club participant is registered as a member of the GAA. The day to day running of the club is managed by its committee.

(b) All players must have FULL Membership paid to avail of insurance/injury benefit fund. (c) All membership applications and renewals are accepted subject to the rules of the Club Constitution. In the event of an application not being accepted, any payments made will be refunded.

(d) Insurance/Injury Fund. The GAA reminds all players, that the playing of Gaelic Football involves the risk of Injury and it is each individual registered player's responsibility to familiarise themselves with the terms and benefits of the GAA Injury Benefit Fund. Each player needs to ensure that they have adequate cover in place to meet their own individual needs and personal circumstances. The GAA Injury Benefit Fund is only in place to cover benefits which cannot be claimed elsewhere and is a benefit cover only. Members should not use the fund as their only recourse or be dependent on the fund to compensate them fully for any losses associated with the injury sustained. In the event of a claim following an injury to a Juvenile Player (under 18 years), it is the Parent's/Guardians responsibility to fill out the insurance forms and contact the Insurance Company. The Insurance Company will require original receipts for any claims. Please keep copies of these before sending receipts to the insurance company.

(e) Mullinalaghta St. Columba's GFC Code of Behaviour addresses the minimum appropriate levels of behaviour, practice and conduct required from our Players, Coaches, Supporters, Parents/Guardians, Referees and Clubs. It is the responsibility of all members to be familiar with the guidelines set forth in the code of conduct.

Data Protection

Data Protection legislation is intended to protect the right to privacy of individuals and seeks to ensure that Personal Information is used appropriately by third parties that may have it. In essence Data Protection relates to any information that can be used to identify a living person such as Name, Date of Birth, Address, Phone Number, Email Address, Membership Number, photographs etc., The General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) is new EU legislation that came into effect on May 25th 2018. It very clearly sets out the ways in which the privacy rights of every EU citizen must be protected and the ways in which a person's 'Personal Data' can and can't be used. It places the onus on the person or entity that collects a person's information to comply with the legislation and to demonstrate compliance.

Data Protection can be summarised in the following 8 'rules'

1. Obtain and process the information fairly
2. Keep it only for one or more specified and lawful purpose
3. Process it only in ways compatible with the purpose for which it was given to you initially
4. Keep it safe and secure
5. Keep it accurate and up-to-date
6. Ensure that it is adequate, relevant and not excessive
7. Retain it no longer than is necessary for the specified purpose or purposes
8. Give a copy of his/her personal data to any individual, on request

Every person must give their consent for their data to be collected and processed for a specific reason. This requested data for inclusion as a member and is obtained for the purposes of registering players and members with their respective associations. Data that has been collected from our members for the purposes of registration will not be shared with third parties and will be kept solely for the purposes for which it is obtained.

The following Privacy Information is being provided to you as outlined in the General Data Protection Regulation. It is intended to inform you of how the Personal Information provided on membership application will be used, by whom and for what purposes. Who is the data controller?

Who is the Data Protection Officer for the GAA and the Club?

What is the purpose of processing my Personal Data?

The purpose for processing your Personal Data is that it is necessary for the performance of a contract in order to register and maintain your membership with the Club and the GAA. The purpose is also to keep you informed of GAA events and fundraisers.

Will anyone else receive a copy of my Personal Data?

Your Personal Data can be accessed by certain members of the County Committees, Provincial Councils and the Central Council of the Gaelic Athletic Association in connection with their administrative functions. This will be done in accordance with our data protection policy only. In the event of an injury or insurance claim, details of your claim which will include your Personal Data will be passed to the GAA's Insurance underwriters, Willis Towers Watson Insurance, Elm Park, Merrion Road, Dublin 4, Ireland.

Where is your Personal Data stored?

Your personal data will be stored in the Club and electronically on Clubforce and electronically on the GAA Membership Database which is provided by Servasport Ltd, 11th Floor, Causeway Tower, 9A James Street South, Belfast, BT2 8DN.

Who is Clubforce?

Clubforce is a “data processor” who hosts the database on behalf of the club on which your information is stored. Clubforce and the Clubforce application are GDPR compliant to ensure your Personal Data is stored safely and securely.

Who is Servasport Limited?

Servasport Limited is a “data processor” who hosts the database on which your information is stored. We have a contract in place with Servasport Limited to ensure your Personal Data is stored safely and securely.

How long will your Personal Data be stored for?

Your Personal Data will be held for the duration of your Membership and it will be deleted by us shortly thereafter in the event that you resign your Membership or you are expelled in accordance with the Official Guide. However, we may retain your Personal Data after your Membership ceases if we decide that it is strictly necessary and proportionate to do so in the circumstances in accordance with our data retention policy.

How can I obtain a copy of the Personal Data held by the Club/GAA?

You have the right to request a copy of all of your Personal Data and can do so by contacting us. This information will be provided to you within one month.

What are my privacy rights relating to my Personal Data?

You also have the right to have your Personal Data updated, rectified, or deleted if you so wish. You have the right to object to your Personal Data being processed and to withdraw your consent to processing - You can do so by contacting us at the details above.
