General Club Rules

- All players must be registered with the Club before they can train or play. <u>There can be no</u> <u>exceptions</u>.
- The registration Fee included insurance which provides cover for the girls only when playing camogie.
- All players must bring their own hurley. *These can be purchased through the Club*. Broken hurleys will be repaired by the club will be replaced by the club at a reduced rate if broken during a club match/ training and are deemed unrepairable.
- Each girl should have a spare hurley
- Shin Guards and helmets must be worn at all times.
- Skorts are required for all competitive matches.
- No young children should be left in the pitch unsupervised during training.
- Underage players must be dropped and collected on time for all training/ matches.
- Use of picture or voice recording on mobile phones is absolutely prohibited in dressing rooms
- All members, coaches/ managers must adhere to the Code of Ethics and Good Practice in Children's Sport.
- All coaches must be registered and Garda Vetted

- PARENTS/ GUARDIANS should encourage their children to:
- Play by the rules.
- Improve their skill levels.
- Appreciate everybody on their team, regardless of ability.
- PARENTS/ GUARDIANS should lead by example:
- Respect officials' decisions and encourage children to do likewise.
- Do not exert undue pressure on your child.
- Never admonish your own child or any other child for their standard of play.
- Be Realistic in their expectations.
- Show approval for effort, not just results.
- Never embarrass a child or use sarcastic remarks toward a player.
- Applaud good play from all teams.
- Do not seek to unfairly affect a game or player.
- Do not enter the field of play unless invited to do so by the official in charge.
- Show approval whether the team wins, loses or draws a game.

• PLAYERS should always:

- Play fairly, so their best and enjoy themselves.
- Respect fellow team members regardless of ability, ethnic origin, cultural background or religion.
- Support fellow team members whether they do well or not so well.
- Represent their team, their club and their family with pride and dignity.
- Respect all coaches, mentors, officials and their opponents.
- Be gracious in defeat and modest in victory.
- Shake hands before and after the game irrespective of the result.
- Inform their coach/ mentor/ manager when they are unavailable for training or matches.
- Talk to the Clubs Welfare Officer with any concerns or questions they may have.
- Adhere to acceptable standards of behaviour.

- Tell somebody if they or someone else have been harmed/injured in any way.
- Take due care of Club Equipment.
- PLAYERS should NOT:
- Cheat always play be the rules
- Shout or argue with an official, teammate or opponent or use violence.
- Use unfair or bullying tactics to gain advantage or isolate other players.
- Spread rumours.
- Tell lies about adults or other young people.
- Play or train if they fell unwell or are injured.
- Use unacceptable language or racial and/ or sectarian references.
